

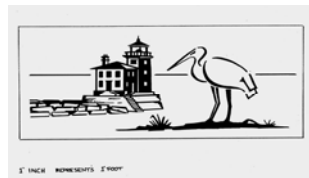

Iconic Art Exhibit: Noise Breakers

The Lake Erie artwork of Charles V. Kushlan will be featured from December 6 to 8 in an exhibit titled “**Noise Breakers**” at the Lake County Engineer’s Office. These are the themes developed as a result of both public meetings and SR2 community decisions on noise wall esthetics.



The purpose of this art exhibit is to allow the public and representatives from the affected SR2 communities to view the lake theme art and give final input as to which Lake Erie images will be used.

Chuck has worked as a sign painter for thirty-five years. He has been commissioned as an illustrator of books and his artwork has appeared in newspapers. His motivation for art comes from giving joy to others. His work is memorable to many locals for innumerable carved pumpkins and “Just Married” signs. His work may be recognized by his artist signature of Van Kushlan or VKushlan. Chuck resides in Montville, Ohio with his wife Kelly.

Noise walls will be constructed along the lake side of SR2 from Wickliffe to SR44 at locations determined by ODOT. The iconic panels will be spaced every 250 feet along the proposed SR2 noise walls. Photo renderings of the proposed font for community name icons will also be on display. Attendees will have an opportunity to rank their art preferences and give input on the community identity icon panels.
